GA Publishers' Awards 2011

The Geographical Association Publishers' Awards are given for materials of UK origin associated with geography in schools and colleges which are considered to make a significant contribution to geographical education and professional development.

Categories

Entries are invited in the following categories:

- A Early Years and Primary**
- B Secondary and Beyond**
- C Professional Development (all phases)**
- D Other**

Any kind of material can be submitted. To qualify, the material must have been first produced in the UK in the twelve months prior to the closing date of 15 November 2010.

Judging criteria

The awards aim to recognise material that is likely to make a significant contribution to geography in primary schools, secondary schools or in colleges (including materials to enhance professional development), and to encourage the creative development of new materials. Worksheets, books, models, computer software, DVDs, websites and other materials may be submitted. Materials should, where appropriate, relate to the national curriculum and take into account equal opportunities.

Judges will take into account:

- the significance of the contribution that the material is likely to make to the quality of geographical education in the UK;
- the quality of the material in terms of geographical content, design, presentation and/or production;
- the usefulness and appropriateness of the product in terms of its application in the geography classroom and/or professional development;
- the originality of the concept or the approach on which the product is based.

Submission

Two copies of each entry should be submitted with a completed entry form, a short report (maximum 300 words) on the significance of the material to geographical education, and a fee of £94.00 (£70.50 for registered charities – proof required). The price includes organisation link from the GA website award pages. They must arrive at GA Headquarters no later than 15 November 2010. Please note that entries will not be returned.

A Gold Certificate will be awarded for the best overall entry. One or more Silver Certificates and/or Highly Commended Certificates may be awarded in each category. The decision of the judges is final. In the event of their being unable to find an entry of sufficient merit, they may not make an Award in a particular category.

The Association reserves the right to publicise and/or exhibit the winning resources and other entries on its website, at conferences and in its journals.
