

GCSE Geography Results Analysis 2008

Entries

Overall entries for GCSE nationally for all subjects are down by 2.7%. This is partly due to 6000 fewer students in the cohort and some early entries for English and maths.

Entries for geography are down by 9262 (4.3%) to 203862 the fifth largest drop amongst the major subjects and geography dropped from 8th to 9th place in terms of entry. Art went above geography. French saw a larger decrease and has gone to 10th place in terms of total entries. History dropped by 1152 entries 0.5%

The reduction in entries for geography was almost equal between males and females.

Males 4733 (-4.0%)

Females 4529 (-4.8%)

Performance

The number of candidates getting A* and A grades was very pleasing increasing to 26.6% from 25.2% in 2007. Candidates taking geography therefore did much better than the national average A* and A pass rate of 20.7%

Performance overall increased with the number of A*-C grades increasing to 68.2% from 66.8%. The compares favourably with the national average for all subjects of 65.7%

The percentage obtaining a grade (A*-G) for geography was 98.1% slightly lower than the national average for all subjects (98.4%)

Gender differences

Differential performance was maintained with girls outperforming boys by 3.7% at A*; 6.9% at A* and A; and 5.9% at A*-C

Entry share over the last three years has stayed much the same at about 44% female and 56% male. This is a pattern that has been consistent for the last twenty years.

Trends over time

The trend in entries over the last eight years has been steadily downwards. There has been a 19% drop over that time, about 2.4% per year so this year (-4.3%) is slightly worse than other years. This compares poorly with the previous two years which only had small reductions in numbers.

Changes by country

There are some differences in the entries by country. Entries were down by 4.1% overall in England and Wales and 9.3% in Northern Ireland. (4.3% UK)

Males were down 3.8% in England, 5.8% in Wales and 6.2% in Northern Ireland (4.0% -UK)
Females were down 4.6% in England, 1.8% in Wales and 12.6 in Northern Ireland (4.8%-UK)
